COMPLIANCE UPDATE - Hand Hygiene

Effective December 12, 2017, "Hand Tap for Hand Hygiene" was rolled out at both Carolinas Medical Center and CMC-Mercy. Much effort and education has gone into standardizing hand hygiene procedures within the hospital system and this, so now this initiative is aimed at ensuring everyone adheres to the protocols set in place. Compliance is important, and it can be difficult for one team professional to tell another team professional that they did not perform hand hygiene when they should have. Hand Tap for Hand Hygiene is a simple using your index and middle fingers together to gently tap the hand of a colleague who inadvertently did not utilize hand hygiene when necessary. Tapping someone's hand with two fingers provides all healthcare workers with a non-verbal, non-threatening way to remind each other to comply.

BCLS for the Healthcare Provider January 24, 8 AM to noon. Cost \$50. Textbook not included. This course is designed for professional rescuers or students required to have professional rescuer certification for their healthcare program of study. The course provides information on adult and pediatric CPR, two-rescuer scenarios, use of the bagvalve mask, foreign-body airway obstruction (conscious and unconscious), AED, special resuscitation situations, and other cardiopulmonary emergencies. Choose HeartCode BLS. The course takes approximately two hours and must be taken before attending the Heartcode BLS Online Skills Check. The test has to be completed in one sitting. Print the Course Completion Certificate to bring to Heartcode BCLS Online Skills Check Part 2.


IT'S SNOWING...WHAT DO I DO NOW?
